Žemaitija National Park

- Park established 23 of April in 1991
- Park area 21 720 ha
- There are 26 lakes and 65 rivers
- Two small towns and 53 villages
- There are 3 500 inhabitants



Park's goals are:

- to conserve the main system of lakes and forests in Žemaitija, the existing cultural heritage and restore the damaged parts;
- to carry out scientific research, data collection and regular monitoring of the Park's environment and ethnic and cultural heritage;
- to cherish the cultural traditions of Žemaitija;

Park's goals (2) are:

- to disseminate ideas and knowledge of environmental protection;
- to encourage traditional forms of farming;
- to promote appropriate recreation activities, and primarily cognitive tourism.

Lakes in Žemaitija National Park


The largest lakes (the lake of Plateliai, Ilgis and Beržoras) occupy approximately 90 percent of total water area. The bottom structure of these lakes is very complex. There are islands in all of them (7 in Plateliai, 2 in Ilgis, 1 in Beržoras).




Lake of Plateliai

Plateliai lake area is 1205 ha, the average depth is 10,5 m, the deepest place is 50 m. The average level above the sea level is 146,5 m. The length of the coast is approximately 31 kilometers.
